This study explores the nature and determinants of corporate disclosure via social media among the top 350 companies listed on the London Stock Exchange. The second paper is “*Using COBIT 5 to Cascade IT Goals for Subdistrict Administrative Organization*”. Jirasak Siriratanapol, Kanokmon Rujirakul, and Laksamee Khomnotai proposes this article to identify IT goals of Subdistrict Administrative Organization (SAO), using COBIT5 method, which is targeted to MaklueaMai Subdistrict Administrative Organization (MkMSAO). Another research paper is proposed by Tanaporn Tarin Sirtanapanta. Her study is “*LINE for Office Work?: The Use of Mobile Instant Messaging (MIM) Application in Thai Business Companies from Managers' Perspective*”. This research studies an increasing use of Mobile Instant Messaging (MIM) application in three business organizations in Thailand from manager's perspective using the qualitative method.

Approaching to legal viewpoint, Natcha Dumthanasarn, Sotarath Thammaboosadee, and Smitti Darakorn Na Ayuthaya proposes “*Comparative Study of Open Government Data Law towards Data Governance Legal Frameworks*”. In this paper, the data governance frameworks are reviewed and compared in legal aspects in several countries. Pakpoom Mookdarsanit and Lawankorn Mookdarsanit proposed the study named “*Contextual Image Classification towards Metadata Annotation of Thai-tourist Attractions*”. In this paper, the comparison between full-supervised learning and eager learning would be studied in the application of metadata of tourist attractions annotation.

The last paper of this volume is “*Geometric Features and Template Matching for English Sentence Handwritten Identification System*”. Tanasanee Phienthrakul presents a handwriting identification system developed by geometric features and template matching features on Android platform to recognize the handwriting in English language.

The current editorial board is working very hard to guarantee timely and high-quality reviews. The whole cycle of reviewing and production has been fast on average. Please enjoy your reading, and we look forward to receiving your high-quality submissions in the future.
